SECTION A: COMPREHENSION

TEXT A

Nothing can keep a good woman down

- 1 47-year-old Zanele Situ is a South African Paralympian all-round athlete; 1 whose area of specialisation is the javelin throw. She has amassed an medals in her time. which include aold the Paralympics and the IPC Athletics World Championships and being the first female South African black athlete to win a Paralympic gold medal.
- 2 This Kokstad born woman first experienced weakness in her legs at the age of twelve, which resulted in the inability to walk. Medical tests discovered a tuberculosis infection in her spine which lead to a two-year semi-coma, from which she ended up disabled and 'strapped' to a wheelchair.
- 3 But nothing can keep a good woman down. In 1998 Situ broke into the international scene when she represented the country in England at the IPC Athletics World Championships. She won gold and bronze in the javelin and discus events respectively. Two years later at the Summer Paralympics in Sydney she walked away with gold and silver in javelin and discus respectively. The gold in Sydney inscribed her name in history books as the first South African female black athlete to win a Paralympic title. In 2002 in Lille (France) again she made headlines as she successfully defended her javelin world title. Unfortunately, her performance in discus was only good enough for a fourth-place finish.
- 4 Her achievements were recognized in 2003 when she was awarded the Order of Ikhamanga (silver). This is a top South African honour granted by the President of South Africa for achievements in arts, culture, literature, music, journalism, and sports. Its recipients are eligible for gold (exceptional achievement), silver (excellent achievement, and bronze 25 (outstanding achievement). There is a school of thought that believes that she actually deserved gold.
- 5 Come 2004 Athens; Situ successfully defended her javelin title at the Summer Paralympics. Although not finishing on the podium in either the shot put or the discus, she was recognized by the International 30 Paralympic Committee with the Whang Youn Dai Achievement Award. Dr Whang Youn Dai (Korea) contracted polio at the age of three. She devoted

her life to the development of Paralympic sport all over the world. The International Paralympic Committee (IPC) recognized her lifelong contributions and established the 'Whang Youn Dai Achievement Award' in 1988. The award is presented at every Paralympic Games to one male and one female athlete who "best exemplify the spirit of the Games and inspire and excite the world". According to the IPC, "the award is for someone who is fair, honest and is uncompromising in his or her values and prioritizes the promotion of the Paralympic Movement above personal recognition." The embattled South African sprinter Oscar Pistorius was a nominee in 2012, but he did not win.

- 6 After Athens, Situ entered a barren period competitively, failing to reach the podium at the 2008 Summer Paralympics in Beijing. She recovered some form in 2011, when she won bronze at Christchurch World 45 Championships, but the emergence of world class competitors, such as Tunisia's Hania Aidi and China's Yang Liwan, made title challenges a difficult task. At the 2012 Summer Paralympics in London the fourth place was the best achievement she could manage.
- 7 But she'd done enough to deserve further recognition by her country. At 50 the Rio Games (2016) she was given the honour of a flag-bearer during the opening ceremony. This well-rounded colossus had this to say:

"I try everything. I believe I can do whatever someone else can – and so I like to help people, especially people with disabilities ... to get out there."




