

WHY IS READING SO IMPORTANT FOR CHILDREN?

- 1. The importance of reading for children cannot be underestimated. Daily reading assists with early cognitive development, which refers to how children perceive and think about the world in reference to processing information.
- 2. Reading also enhances children's ability to develop empathy; when we read books, we put ourselves in the shoes of the characters, therefore allowing us to develop compassion and empathy as we find ways to identify and sympathise with the characters.
- 3. Books may also help children build stronger relationships with parents or guardians. If a parent reads with a child on a regular basis, then they will undoubtedly develop a stronger relationship with them. Reading provides parents with an opportunity to bond with their children in a way that is beneficial to both parties.
- 4. Reading aloud leads to improved literary skills as it allows them to focus on the sounds and pronunciation of words. Reading to children in even the earliest months of their lives can help with language acquisition and stimulating the part of the brain that processes language.
- 5. Reading also leads to a more extensive vocabulary. Through reading on a daily basis, children are exposed to a range of new words and phrases that they may not have heard otherwise. Reading for enjoyment may also lead to higher levels of creativity and imagination as well as overall understanding and deciphering abilities which are vital in all learning areas.
